We then explored the towers and learnt about the history behind them. This included the Bloody Tower and The White Tower. We saw armour, guns and medals. We also saw which animals were previous owned by the Tower and used to live there. Our favourite was discovering a polar bear

used to live there and hunted for fish in the Thames. Before we went home, we saw the Crown Jewels and the soldiers that guarded them. It was an amazing trip.

Year 2 Trip to the Tower of London

When we arrived, we first went into The White Tower. We explored the armoury, admiring the different equipment, arms, armour and treasures that were used over the years as well the different methods of torture they used. We completed a workshop with Sir Thomas, where we wowed him with our knowledge about The Great Fire of London, detailing where, how and why the fire started, what happened to the Farriners and London during and after the fire. We got to see how an original house was built before the fire - The King's House was built in the 1500s.

We climbed what felt like thousands of steps as we crossed the stone battlements surrounding the tower, spotting different London landmarks and talking about their defensive tactics. Additionally, we looked at the guardians of the tower, the ravens; met a Beefeater and Yeomen Warders; explored the different royal beasts that would have been kept at the Tower of London as well as marvelling the crown jewels.





Reception had some very special visitors this week, which included Sophie the T-rex. We met some baby dinosaurs and found out about what they ate. We discussed herbivores, carnivores and omnivores, and luckily Sophie had eaten breakfast before we met her as we found out that she is a carnivore. We spent some time being palaeontologists and discovered a variety of fossils and identified the creatures that they came from. Apples and Pears had a very exciting morning and now all want to be palaeontologists when they grow up!





A busy week for Year 4...

Year 4 at Herringham have been very busy in the last week. They visited Duxford IWM and enjoyed looking at the WW2 vehicles they had been learning about and drew some accurate sketches of the Spitfire, Hurricane and Messerschmitt. 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


